The Norwegian Government's work programme for cooperation with the EU 2019


Under the EEA and Norway Grants, Norway is engaged in cooperation to build national capacity in **the justice sector**, including efforts to strengthen correctional services, the police and the courts, and bring them into line with European standards.

Norway gives priority to cooperation with **Poland, Lithuania, Romania and Bulgaria** in this area.

The Government also gives priority to efforts and cooperation under the EEA and Norway Grants **to combat violence against women and domestic and gender-based violence**.


In 2019, Norway will further develop the interdisciplinary **Synergy network**, which was established in 2018, to strengthen cooperation between the beneficiary countries and Norwegian actors working to combat domestic and gender-based violence.


Concerted action is needed!

Violence against women is more common in Europe than you may think

- 1 in 3 women has experienced sexual violence, physical violence, or both
- 1 in 3 has experienced psychologically abusive behaviour by an intimate partner
- 1 in 5 has experienced stalking
- More than 1 in 2 have experienced sexual harassment
- 1 in 20 has been raped
- 95 % of victims of trafficking for sexual exploitation in the EU are women

Network Platform



- Deals with the violence in a comprehensive manner
- New provisions
 - Requiring a specific institutional set up
 - Foresee concrete measures to prevent, protect and prosecute
- Links the violence expressly to gender stereotypes
- Establishes a new international body for monitoring national implementation GREVIO

the 4 Ps

1. Integrated **P**olicies that enables measures to;
2. **P**revent violence against women and domestic violence,
3. **P**rotect victims, and
4. **P**rosecute perpetrators.



the 7 Cs

1. Comprehensive measures
2. Concerted actions by many
3. Collection of data and research

The Agreement on the European Economic Area (EEA): the EEA/Norway Grants

- The Agreement on the European Economic Area (EEA) is the cornerstone of relations between Norway and the EU. It brings together the 28 EU member states and the three EEA EFTA states Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein in the internal market governed by the same basic rules.
- The EEA and Norway Grants are the main financial instrument of Norway's European policy.
- A total of EUR 2.8 billion (approximately NOK 26.6 billion) is available under the grants scheme for the period 2014-2021.
- The aim is to address common European challenges
